**MOTION**

**THAT** the Municipal Association of Victoria (MAV) call on VicRoads through the relevant political channels including the State Roads Minister, local politicians and other relevant bodies and individuals for a dramatic increase in VicRoads basic road maintenance budget. This especially applies to the rural areas of this State, as when annual CPI is taken into account the budget is actually decreasing.

Councillor Comments:

There are real concerns being expressed by many residents of Mitchell Shire regarding basic road maintenance issues on all roads but especially on many of VicRoads main and arterial roads. Council is making a concerted effort to improve basic road maintenance on its infrastructure and would like to see a similar response from VicRoads. Main areas of concern relate to "potholes" road surface condition, (e.g. Lancefield/Kilmore Road) drainage, roadside weeds and vegetation management inside and outside the road envelope, this includes weed management. Many Victorians live in a fire prone areas and adequate vegetation management is extremely important as are sight lines in the mitigation of road safety risks.

I hereby give notice of my intention to move the following motion at the Ordinary Council Meeting to be held on 16 April 2018.

**MOTION**

**THAT** the Municipal Association of Victoria (MAV) advocate for Victoria to adopt a container deposit scheme, and to encourage the whole of Australia to adopt such to discourage beverage litter and pollution by offering a partial refund for the return of empty beverage containers.

Councillor Comment:

Container Deposit Scheme (CDS) needs to be extended to the rest of the country. It is in SA, NT and now NSW. WA and Queensland are set to start in 2019. In the US ten (10) states are doing it.

Wouldn't it be more synergistic to apply it to the whole country. It would make more economical sense that the labelling of packaging be changed once rather than every time a new state/territory joins the CDS. The Federal Government need to also get on board. Consumers who think it is going to cost more may be deceived. It is a "deposit" scheme. You get your deposit back, but only if you return it rather than throw it or illegally dump it. If you decide to be one of these, then it will most likely be picked up [and cashed in] by a child or a socio-economically disadvantaged person.

National Geographic research, published in Marine Policy, has found "that container deposits reduce the amount of beverage containers on the coasts of both the United States and Australia by 40%. What's more, the reduction is even more pronounced in areas of lower socio-economic status, where plastic waste is most common."

The NSW EPA website says "Drink container litter makes up 44% of the volume of all litter in the state and costs more than \$162 million to manage."

Should everyone be paying for those that decide to incorrectly dispose of containers?

We acknowledge that businesses making the products must cover their costs [change of label etc] which are one-off but the user is the one who should pay for "their" litter and not the general wider community. A similar adage is - Users pay a toll on Toll roads that cost a lot of money.

"The ultimate goal of WMAA is to achieve sustainable and environmentally sensitive waste management across the entire industry," said CEO Gayle Sloan.
